It's times like these, we see who true heroes are. We're with you – and together we will Rise Together.



Steve Purves

President & CEO, Valleywise Health

Steve Purves became President & Chief Executive Officer of Valleywise Health (formerly named Maricopa Integrated Health System) in Phoenix, Arizona in September 2013. Valleywise Health is Arizona's largest and longest serving public teaching hospital and healthcare system and includes the Valleywise Health Medical Center, the Arizona Burn Center, the Arizona Children's Center, a Level I Trauma Center, three inpatient behavioral health centers and a network of 13 Federally Qualified Health Centers that serve Phoenix and



Maricopa County. Valleywise Health is part of the Creighton University Arizona Health Education Alliance and has 10 ACGME accredited residency programs with over 350 residents, hundreds of medical student rotations and significant nursing and allied health training programs.

Mr. Purves works with the publicly elected five-member Board of Directors who represent the Maricopa County Special Health Care District, to provide executive leadership for the growth and development of Valleywise Health. Since 2013, Mr. Purves led a \$170 million financial turnaround and helped secure \$935 million in general obligation bonds passed by voter referendum in 2014. These funds allow Valleywise Health to replace aging facilities, including its teaching hospital, and to reinvent its' care model to better serve the public in the years to come.

Mr. Purves is actively involved in the community as an ambassador for Valleywise Health and in a variety of roles outside his health care duties. He serves on the boards of America's Essential Hospitals, the Arizona Hospital and Health Care Association, the Arizona State University Health Advisory Board and Health Futures Council, the Creighton University Arizona Health Education Alliance, Valleywise Health Foundation and the Arizona Chamber of Commerce. He was elected Chairman of the Arizona Hospital and Healthcare Association in 2017. He is a delegate on the Regional Policy Board of the American Hospital Association, and is a member of Greater Phoenix Leadership.

Mr. Purves has over 39 years of service as a health care executive serving in the investor-owned, public, academic and private not-for-profit settings. He has numerous awards and honors; including an appointment by the Secretary of the Army as a Civilian Aide for South Carolina in 2001. He was awarded the U.S. Army Outstanding Civilian Service Medal in 2006. He was named one of the top 25 most influential leaders in Phoenix, Arizona by the Phoenix Business Journal in 2017. He was appointed as an honorary commander of the 161st Air Refueling Wing of the Arizona Air National Guard in 2020. He was the recipient of political advocacy awards from the American Hospital and the Florida Hospital Associations, and in 2013, was honored with the presentation of the "Key to the City" by the mayor of the City of Ocala during his time in Florida.

He received his Master's Degree in Healthcare Administration from Trinity University in San Antonio, Texas, and his Bachelor's Degree in Health Education from Springfield College in Springfield, MA. Purves is also a Fellow of the American College of Healthcare Executives (FACHE).

Purves is a native of Roanoke, Virginia. He and his wife, Mary Anne, have two adult children and two young grandchildren.

Valleywise Health Foundation's Legacy Circle Night of Heroes launched in April 2017 to honor patient heroes whose recovery from life-changing injuries inspired a ripple effect of giving back to others.

Envisioned by Valleywise Health Board Chairman Mark Dewane in 2017, the unique "experiential event" would allow Valleywise Health supporters an opportunity to invite friends, community leaders and prospective donors to a one-of-a kind evening to learn more about the critical work of the Valley's public teaching health system. Three theater-quality films would share the hero's journey. 1. The Accident 2. The Recovery and 3. The Ripple Effect, followed by a moderated conversation and Q&A session with longtime Phoenix media personality, Karie Dozer.

The inaugural Night of Heroes honoree was retired Phoenix police officer and nationally known speaker, **Jason Schechterle**, and the heroic first responders and medical team involved in his lifesaving care at the Arizona Burn Center.

Subsequent events honored retired Navy Special Forces parachute rigger **Tim Schlappi**, and flight paramedic turned emergency nurse, **Derek Boehm**, RN and the Valleywise Health trauma and emergency experts who saved their lives.

In response to requests to expand the compelling film content at Night of Heroes, rather than a three part series, in 2020 a 20-minute short film documentary was planned to share Isabella's story. 5:15 PM

It would include a cookout, kids games, bikes, skateboards, and chatting around the fire. With corned beef and cabbage cooking in the house and burgers on the grill, Lilly headed outside to help.

JD, Isabella, Zachary and their neighbors were near the unlit fire pit. Isabella's 8 year-old friend wanted to go for a bike ride, but with party set up underway Lilly wasn't comfortable letting her go on her own. Lilly got on a bike to ride down the street. When she returned the McCune's life would change forever.

Their next nine months would revolve around the Arizona Burn Center at Valleywise Health.

The Arizona Burn Center team would forever be changed by Isabella McCune.
