2020 was the most challenging year in our lifetime for health care across the nation due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

As Arizona's public teaching and safety net health system, Valleywise Health has stepped up to address Arizona's most critical healthcare needs and served as a place of healing and comfort for ALL who walk through our doors. Our healthcare heroes have faced unprecedented challenges and stepped up - when our community needed them most - with resilience, compassion and exceptional care - fulfilling the Valleywise Health mission - to provide exceptional care, without exception, every patient, every time.

Despite the challenges, the excellent care provided by our clinical colleagues was appropriately recognized in 2020 with Valleywise Health being named an IBM Watson Health Top 100 Hospital. We continued our "Care Reimagined" plan to rebuild and reinvent our safety net system of care and teaching hospital. Valleywise opened two new Valleywise Community Health Centers in South Phoenix/Laveen and North Phoenix and the Valleywise Comprehensive Health Center in Peoria. We also are currently under construction for the NEW Valleywise Health Medical Center scheduled to open in 2023.

Your support of Valleywise Health Foundation directly impacted countless patients, programs, and employees at Arizona's public teaching health system.

In 2020, YOU helped our Foundation...

- Provide more than \$1,400,000 in COVID-19 emergency relief
- Secure funding to assist with a new medical education simulation training program with a \$3,000,000 grant from the Maricopa County IDA
- Qualify for a \$215,000 grant to address critical health needs of safety net patients

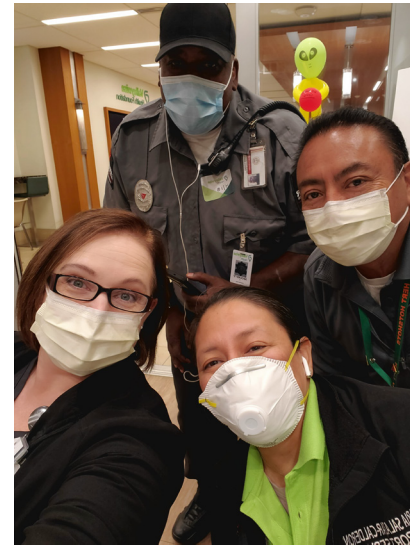

Valleywise Health's Role *in the pandemic*

Since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, Valleywise Health has delivered on its mission - exceptional care, without exception, every patient, every time, and was recently named an IBM Watson Health Top 100 Hospitals.



From quickly transforming its Pediatric Emergency Department into the first intensive care unit for suspected or confirmed COVID-19 patients, to launching in-house COVID-19 lab testing and increasing telehealth capabilities, Valleywise moved swiftly to protect the health of each and every one of us – regardless of the neighborhood we call home.

Valleywise acquired the Cepheid GenExpert, providing COVID-19 test results in 45 minutes, allowing for less use of PPE for patients and providers while waiting for results. Valleywise also initiated an extensive telemedicine program in the matter of days and has now performed more than 147,000 telehealth consultations – representing nearly half the system's visits since March.

Working with District Medical Group physician, Dr. Michael Do, Valleywise filmed and distributed COVID-19 information videos in 10 languages to serve the Valley's diverse refugee communities. Now with more than 218,000 collective views on YouTube, the videos helped educate communities about the pandemic in culturally relevant, understandable ways. Valleywise doctors and staff also created COVID-19 programming for local radio stations and newspapers in both English and Spanish.

Valleywise was among the first in the state protecting patients and providers with visitor restrictions and, through generous community support, implemented video visitations for patients and their families — especially for end-of-life care. Our leaders collaborated with national, state and local officials to obtain protective equipment and supplies for health care professionals statewide and partnered with Central Arizona Shelter Services to provide a safe place for discharged homeless patients to recover.



Valleywise Health Foundation was awarded a \$3 million grant from the Maricopa County Industrial Development Authority to assist in developing a comprehensive medical simulation training program.



During the COVID-19 pandemic, Valleywise Health Foundation received generous in-kind donations including PPE, hand-sewn masks, 1,300 thank you cards as well as meals donated by 132 local restaurants.



In April 2020, Valleywise Health Foundation was awarded an emergency \$500,000 grant by Virginia G. Piper Charitable Trust to support COVID-19 emergency needs at Valleywise Health, Arizona's public teaching health system.



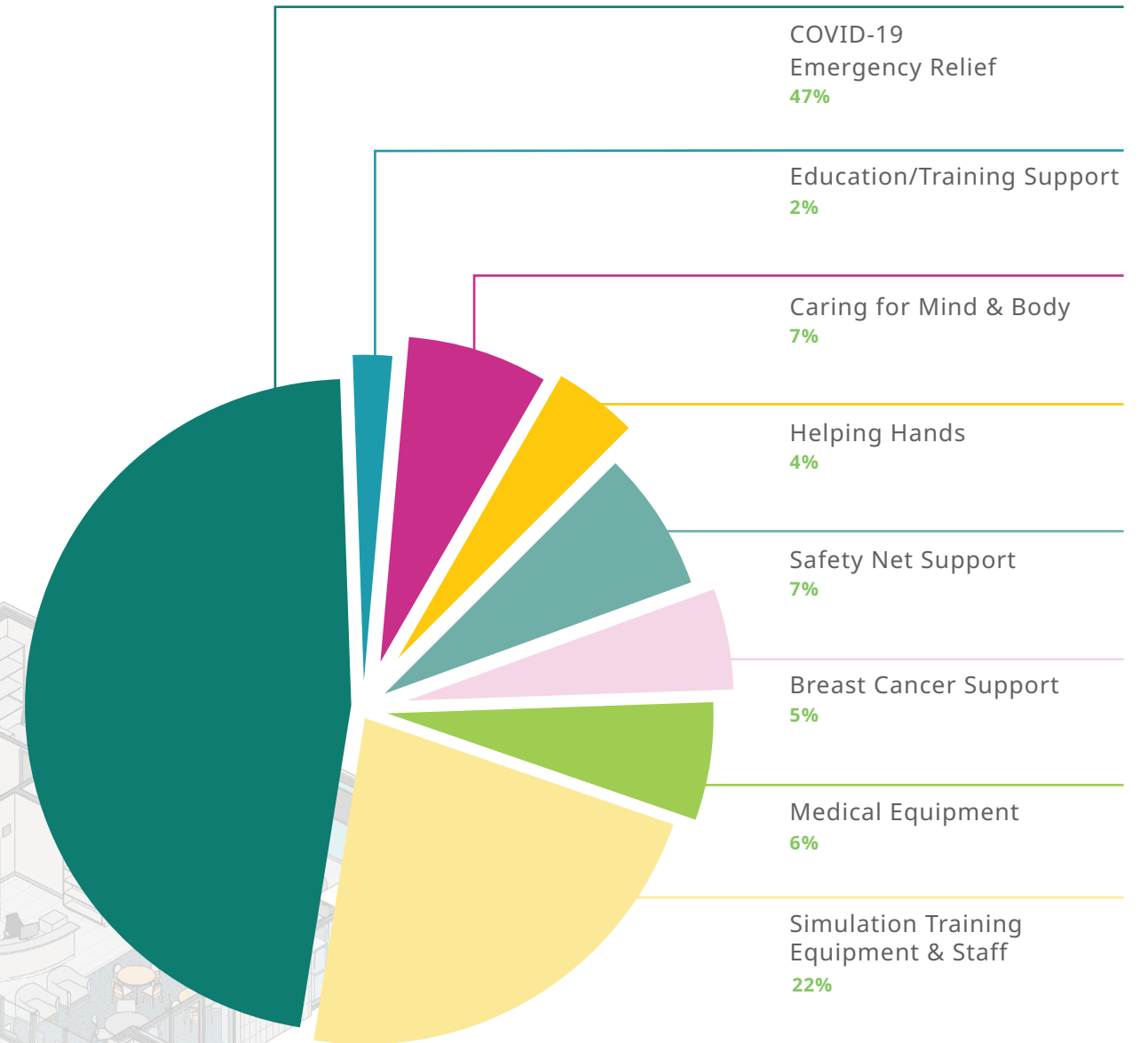
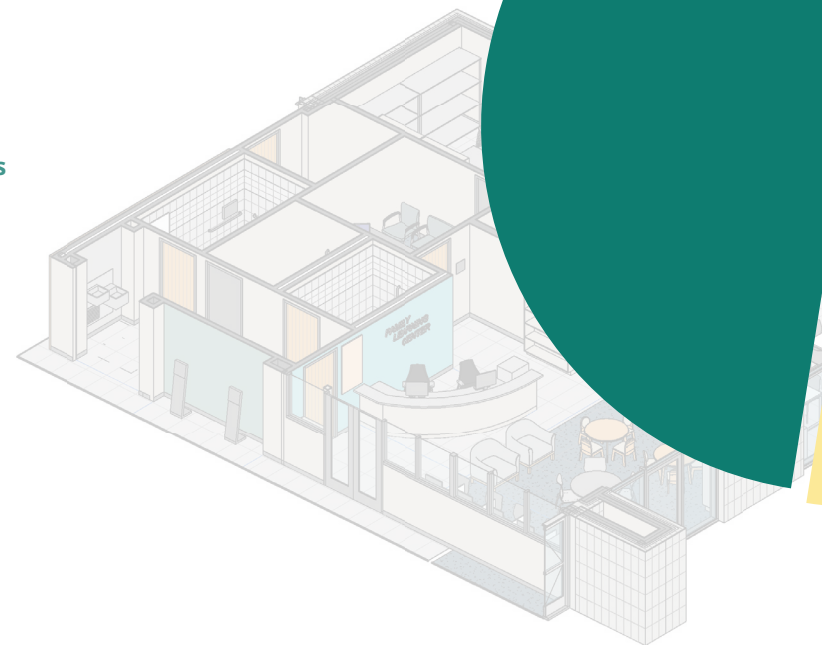
